Market/Price Risk   This is the possibility for an investor to experience losses due to the changes in market prices of securities (e.g., bonds and equities). It is the exposure to the uncertain market value of a portfolio due to price fluctuations. It is the risk of the UITF to lose value due to a decline in securities prices, which may sometimes happen rapidly or unpredictably. The value of investments fluctuate over a given time period because of general market conditions, economic changes or other events that impact large portions of the market such as political events, natural calamities, etc. As a result, the Net Asset Value per Unit (NAVPU) may increase to make profit or decrease to incur loss.						

Liquidity Risk	This is the possibility for an investor to experience losses due to the inability to sell or convert assets into cash immediately or in instances where conversion to cash is possible but at a loss. These may be caused by different reasons such as trading in securities with small or few outstanding issues, absence of buyers, limited buy/sell activity or underdeveloped capital market. Liquidity risk occurs when certain securities in the UITF portfolio may be difficult or impossible to sell at a particular time which may prevent the redemption of investment in UITF until assets can be converted to cash. Even government securities which are the most liquid of fixed income securities may be subjected to liquidity risk particularly if a sizeable volume is involved.
Credit/Default Risk	Possibility for an investor to experience losses due to borrower's failure to pay principal and/or interest in a timely manner on instruments such as bonds, loans, or other forms of security which the borrower issued. Inability of the borrower to make good on its financial obligations may have resulted from adverse changes in its financial condition thus, lowering credit quality of the security, and consequently lowering the price (market/price risk) which contributes to the difficulty in selling such security. It also includes risk on a counterparty (a party the UITF Fund Manager trades with) defaulting on a contract to deliver its obligation or in the case of a counterparty, when it fails to deliver on the agreed trade. This decline in the value of the UITF happens because the default/failure would make the price of the security go down and may make the security difficult to sell. As these happen, the UITF's NAVPU will be affected by a decline in value.

Investments in the said outlets were approved by the Trust Committee. Likewise, all related party transactions are conducted on an arm's length and best execution basis and within established limits.

### Stock Market

Local equities came under pressure in the fourth quarter as President Donald Trump's election triggered a capital flight from emerging markets back to the US. Trump's policies on trade, immigration, and tax cuts potentially have an inflationary impact on the US and may prompt the US Federal Reserve to scale back on its monetary policy easing which it began in 2024. As a result, interest rates in the US surged as investors anticipate higher inflation while the US Dollar strengthened on a favorable interest rate differential.

The Philippine Peso came under pressure, registered its weakest levels in history and triggered an exodus of foreign funds from the stock market. The stark reversal of foreign activity, from being net buyers amid the third quarter rally to heavy sellers in the fourth quarter pushed the index lower by 10.23% during the period and erased most of the gains of the index for the year.

Inflation continued to come in benign in the fourth quarter, staying below 3% and provided the BSP to cut interest rates down to 5.75%, lower by 0.75% for 2024. However, the cautious stance of the US Fed in the face of policy uncertainty from Trump has influenced the BSP to likewise telegraph a more measured approach to cutting rates in 2025. A scaling back of expectations of sustained interest cuts has been detrimental to equity market valuations with the market multiple compressing to 12x despite earnings on track to grow by double digits in 2024.

AB Capital Equity Fund Performance

The AB Capital Equity Fund posted a decline of 5.39% in the fourth quarter of 2024. The Net Asset Value Per Unit (NAVPU) decreased to 3.5052 as of December 31, 2024 from 3.7050 as of September 30, 2024.

## Equity Fund Strategy

The Fund remains highly selective in positioning and has focused allocation in companies with clear competitive advantages, high earnings quality, and attractive valuations as these companies may benefit the most from the improving market conditions.

## LIST OF PROSPECTIVE INVESTMENTS

Pursuant to the foregoing objectives, the Fund may be invested and reinvested in:

- a) Listed and soon to be listed (Initial Public Offering) common stocks, preferred stocks, and securities convertible into or exchangeable to common stocks;
- b) Fixed-income securities issued by the government and corporations such as but not limited to, commercial papers, bonds, non-convertible preferred shares exchange-traded equity securities, collective investment plans of the trustee/other trustees and other marketable securities that are traded in an organized exchange market;
- c) Other investments allowed under regulations issued by the BSP. which are applicable to the Fund.

The combined exposure of the Fund to any entity and its related parties shall not exceed fifteen percent (15%) of the market value of the Fund. Provided, that Fund investments, partially or substantially, in exchange traded equity securities shall be subject to the fifteen percent (15%) exposure limit to a single entity/issuer. This limit, however, shall not apply to non-risk assets
