INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND STRATEGY

The Fund Intends to achieve for its participants long-term capital growth and income by investing in a diversified portfolio of high-grade marketable securities allocated in fixed income and equity securities listed in the Philippine Stock Exchange. The allocation for equity securities shall be between 40% to 60% of the portfolio or any other allocation range that may be prescribed by the Trust Association of the Philippines (TOAP) in consultation with the regulatory authorities. The Fund aims to surpass its composite benchmark of 60% Bloomberg Philippine Sovereign Bond Index 1 to 5 Year (BPHIL15) and 40% Philippine Stock Exchange Index (PSEI).

BPHIL15 is a market value weighted index based on PHP government bond issuances of the Bureau of Treasury. Its qualified constituents are securities with at least one year of maturity, but not longer than five years. For additional information on benchmark construction, please contact Bloomberg.

The PSEI is the main index of the Philippine Stock Exchange. It is used to measure the performance of equity securities that represent the Philippine stock market. The Bloomberg and the PSE Website provide additional information on the benchmarks.

CLIENT SUITABILITY

- The AB CAPITAL BALANCED FUND is suitable for individual and corporate investors who are at least classified as balanced based on their risk profile and who are aware of the opportunity for high yields that portfolios with stock market investments may provide but are also knowledgeable of the possibility of capital losses that such investments may entail.
- In order to minimize risks and maximize returns, the participants are recommended to stay invested in the Fund for more than three (3) years.

KEY RISKS AND RISK MANAGEMENT

Interest Rate Risk	This is the possibility for an investor to experience losses due to the changes in interest rate. The purchase and sale of a debt instrument may result in profit or loss because the value of a debt instrument changes inversely with prevailing interest rates.
Market/Price Risk	This is the possibility for an investor to experience losses due to the changes in market prices of securities (e.g., bonds and equities). It is the exposure to the uncertain market value of a portfolio due to price fluctuations. It is the risk of the UITF to lose value due to a decline in securities prices, which may sometimes happen rapidly or unpredictably. The value of investments fluctuate over a given time period because of general market conditions, economic changes or other events that impact large portions of the market such as political events, natural calamities, etc. As a result, the Net Asset Value per Unit (NAVPU) may increase to make profit or decrease to incur loss.

Liquidity Risk	This is the possibility for an investor to experience losses due to the inability to sell or convert assets into cash immediately or in instances where conversion to cash is possible but at a loss. These may be caused by different reasons such as trading in securities with small or few outstanding issues, absence of buyers, limited buy/sell activity or underdeveloped capital market. Liquidity risk occurs when certain securities in the UITF portfolio may be difficult or impossible to sell at a particular time which may prevent the redemption of investment in UITF until assets can be converted to cash. Even government securities which are the most liquid of fixed income securities may be subjected to liquidity risk particularly if a sizeable volume is involved.
Credit/Default Risk	This is the possibility for an investor to experience losses due to borrower's failure to pay principal and/or interest in a timely manner on instruments such as bonds, loans, or other forms of security which the borrower issued. Inability of the borrower to make good on its financial obligations may have resulted from adverse changes in its financial condition thus, lowering credit quality of the security, and consequently lowering the price (market/price risk) which contributes to the difficulty in selling such security. It also includes risk on a counterparty (a party the UITF Fund Manager trades with) defaulting on a contract to deliver its obligation either in cash or securities. This is the risk of losing value in the UITF portfolio in the event the borrower defaults on his obligation or in the case of a counterparty, when it fails to deliver on the agreed trade. This decline in the value of the UITF happens because the default/failure would make the price of the security go down and may make the security difficult to sell. As these happen, the UITF's NAVPU will be affected by a decline in value.



OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY

Stock Market

Philippine equities closed the year on a fragile but improving footing after a volatile fourth quarter marked by weak growth, political noise, and persistent foreign selling. October extended the market's slide, with the index sinking below 6,000 amid continued outflows and concerns over stalled infrastructure spending tied to the flood-control probe. Although the BSP surprised with a 25-bp rate cut to 4.75% and inflation remained benign, the peso's plunge to a record near Php59/\$ complicated the policy outlook and kept sentiment defensive. Property and banks led declines, while select defensives such as ICT and MER attracted inflows.

November proved turbulent, with the PSEi swinging between multi-year lows and sharp relief rallies following a steep 3Q GDP miss (4% YoY) and a contraction in FDI. Still, hopes for further BSP easing, affirmation of the country's BBB+ rating, and the lifting of U.S. tariffs on key agri exports helped the index reclaim 6,000. By December, softer inflation enabled another rate cut, lifting cyclicals and gold-linked names. Despite a modest year-end bounce, the market finished 2025 down 7.3% YoY, weighed by \$873m in net foreign outflows and lingering growth and governance concerns.

Fixed-Income Market

The Philippine bond yield curve continued to bull steepen over the quarter with demand concentrated on short to medium term securities. GDP continued to decline down to 4.0% for Q3 of 2025, due to weakening consumption and a lack of infrastructure spending.

On the policy front, the BSP continued to lower their key rate down to 4.5%. Despite declining growth, they hinted at the end of their rate cut cycle as USDPHP limit further policy moves.

With both inflation and GDP below target, we anticipate further monetary easing to stimulate growth contrary to BSP guidance. As a result, we maintain our overweight on duration in parts of the curve where we see value.

AB Capital Balanced Fund Performance

The AB Capital Balanced Fund posted a gain of 2.46% in the fourth quarter of 2025. The Net Asset Value Per Unit (NAVPU) decreased to 1.3860 as of December 31, 2025, from 1.3527 as of September 30, 2025.

Balanced Fund Strategy

Fixed income saw favorable movement over the quarter as weak growth and low inflation kept demand for the asset class strong.

Local equities remain attractive from a relative standpoint as valuations remain at multi-year lows. The recent corruption probe might hinder macroeconomic indicators in the short-term, but we believe this has already been priced in.

For the first quarter of 2026, we see bond yields grinding down at a slower pace as inflation gradually trends upward from counter-base effects. Equities are expected to see better demand as all-time-high global equities valuations trigger bargain-hunting in cheaper markets.

LIST OF PROSPECTIVE INVESTMENTS

Pursuant to the foregoing objectives, the Fund may be invested and reinvested in:

- a) Listed and soon to be listed (Initial Public Offering) common stocks, preferred stocks, and securities convertible into or exchangeable to common stocks;
- b) Fixed-income securities issued by the government and corporations such as but not limited to, commercial papers, bonds, exchange-traded fixed income securities; and other marketable securities that are traded in an organized exchange or market; and
- c) Other investments allowed under regulations issued by the BSP which are applicable to the Fund.

The combined exposure of the Fund to any entity and its related parties shall not exceed fifteen percent (15%) of the market value of the Fund. Provided, that Fund investments, partially or substantially, in exchange traded equity securities shall be subject to the fifteen percent (15%) exposure limit to single entity/issuer. This limit, however, shall not apply to non-risk assets as defined by the Bangko Sentral.
